英文題目：Occult renal cell carcinoma with stomach, liver, and pancreas metastasis: A case report

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Abstract: Renal cell carcinoma with metastasis to stomach is rare. The present study describes a 62-year-old male visited the CRS department of the Tri-Service General Hospital for colon scopy due to stool with occult blood and abdominal fullness. Liver mass was accidentally found from abdominal sonography and abdominal computed tomography revealed mass not only in the liver but in pancreas tail, and omentum. Gastrointestinal panendoscopy also revealed metastatic lesion in stomach but revealed poorly differentiated tumor. Initially, he was diagnosed with adenocarcinoma of pancreas tail with liver and stomach metastasis. He received Gemcitabine treatment but in vain. Due to exacerbation of gastric bleeding, he underwent gastrointestinal scopy with stomach biopsy and pathology report described as metastatic clear cell renal cell carcinoma. And then treatment changed to *SUTENT*® (sunitinib malate) was also effective. However, from all the image of computed tomography and magnetic resonance imaging cannot detect any lesions in both kidneys. To the best of our knowledge, the renal cell carcinoma with metastasis to stomach is rare; but invisible renal mass is not reported.
